LOGO AND MOTTO



The Emblem of the Gurugram University is a symbolic expression of the confluence of both ancient methodologies and technological advancements.

The “deeya” (radiant lamp) at the top depicts human energy. As the light of deeya provides us joy and hope; similarly we at Gurugram University will be enlightening the life of students with the truth, knowledge, hope and success. It also symbolises “अण्ण दीपो भव” the last words of Lord Buddha stating that be and discover your own light.

The Rising Sun at the bottom symbolizes knowledge and enlightenment and cleaves the darkness through the light of knowledge. “तमसो मा ज्योतिर्गमय” O’ Lord! Take me from darkness to light.

The two twigs of leaves in Hindu Philosophy depicts Vanaspathi (also called as Aushadi) held in the hands of Lord Dhanvanthri, which are the sources of all medicines. In Western Philosophy it symbolize Olive branches which is an expression of Peace, Love and Harmony.

Book at the centre of Emblem clearly depicts its significant role in our life. As it is said “When you open a book, you open a new world”. As books have become inevitable to mankind. Man is mortal but books are immortal.

Globe represents global collaboration; global leadership which is one of the core value of Gurugram University. The university will be active on the International front and will be vigorously forging and consolidating connections with other foreign Universities in a bid to bring international exposure to its faculty and students. It also represents the spirit of “वसुधैव कुटुम्बकम्” The whole world is like a family. It also reflect the spirit of global city that is Gurugram

Human Brain portrays Brainstorming which is a group creativity technique by which efforts are made to find a conclusion for a specific problem by gathering a list of ideas spontaneously contributed by its members. The University pledge to join hand in hand to work together with the approach of generating new ideas around a specific interest. It also signifies the school of health, paramedical sciences and brain

research.

Scientifically, major part of our brain is in unconscious and subconscious state. It is only very small part which is conscious. Everything lies within us. The only question is how to bring it out? It is believed that a genius like Einstein could also use 1/10th of his brain. Most of the discoveries have come from subconscious mind. The Bodhi tree is symbolic of both Sansara (world) and Dharma. Buddha got enlightened under the Bodhi tree. He then stood up and watched the tree from a distance for seven days. He took sixteen steps towards the tree and under each step, blossomed a Lotus flower. **Lotus flower symbolizes clarity, dispassion, love, beauty and purity.** As the lotus blooms and flourishes amongst impurities and does not look back; same is **our motto as we believe in representing something new and pure above all odds.** “ॐ असतो मा सद्गमय” O' Lord take me from untruth to truth.

The name of city “**Gurugram**” carries forward to the University which itself is after the name of **Guru Dronacharya who is clearly visible in our emblem.** In the epic Mahabharata, Guru Dronacharya was the royal preceptor to the Kauravas and Pandavas. The bow and arrow in the emblem represent ancient era. Deities and heroes in several mythologies are described as archers, including the Indian Lord Rama and Lakshmana, the Greek Artemis and Apollo, the Roman Diana and Cupid, The famous archery competition of hitting the eye of a rotating fish while watching its reflection in the water bowl was one of the many archery skills depicted in the Mahabharata. **It also signifies the type of education imparted by Guru Dronacharya to his disciples and is also the trademark of two great warriors Arjuna and Eklavya.**

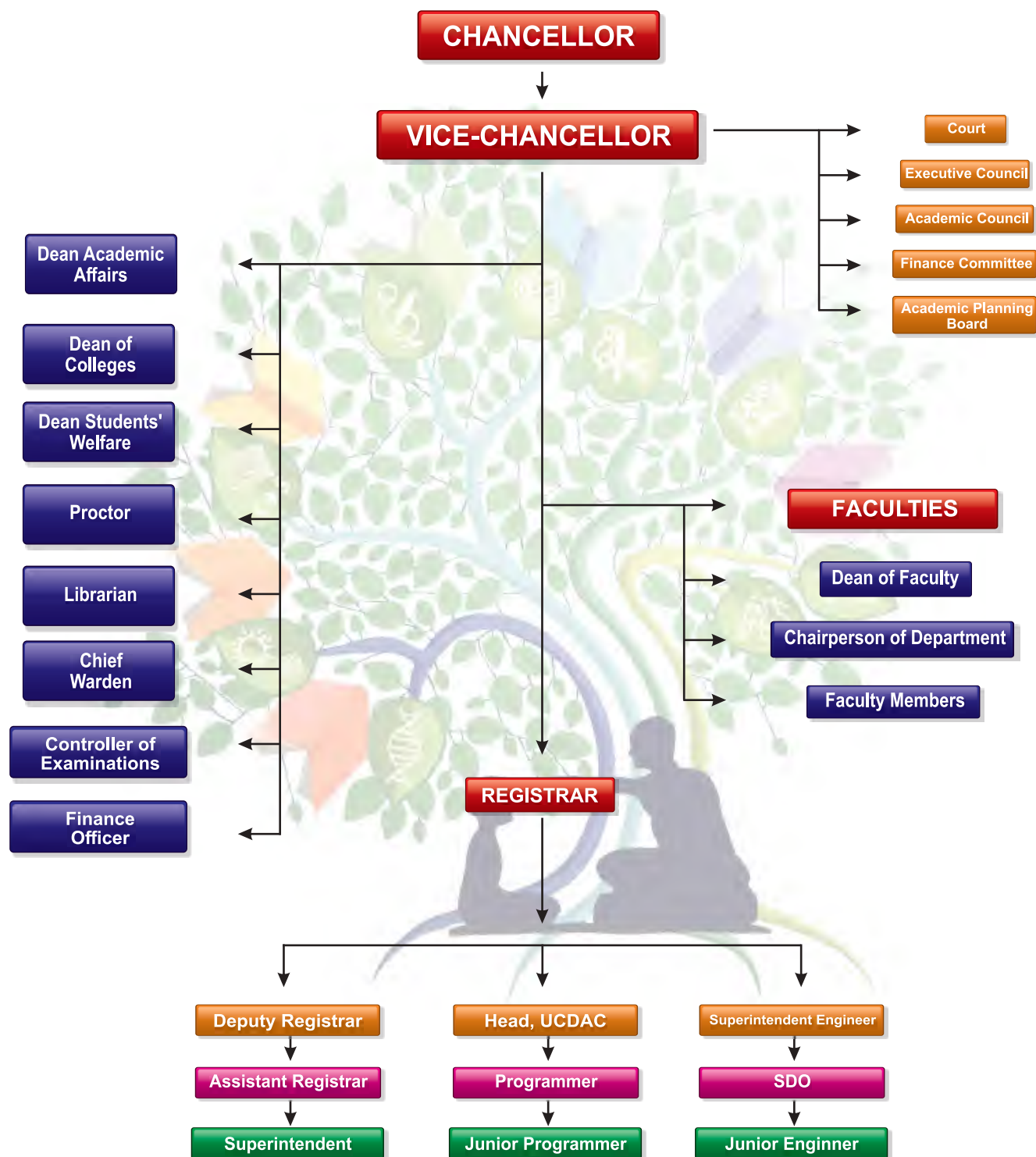

Gurugram University will be active on the International front as well. University will be vigorously forging and consolidating connections with other foreign Universities in a bid to bring international exposure to its faculty and students.

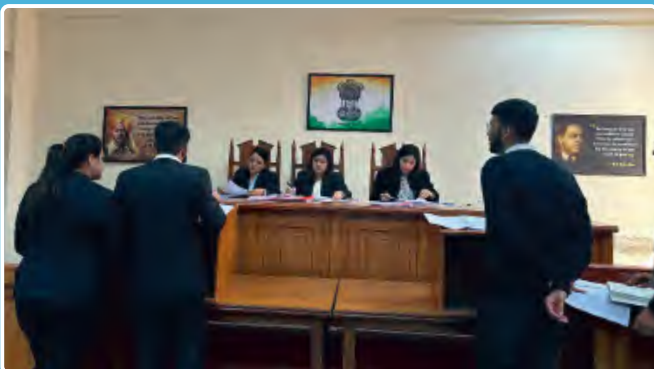

HOW TO APPLY

Foreign candidates are required to fill **Online Application** through the website of Gurugram University, Gurugram (<http://www.gurugramuniversity.ac.in>) as follows:



DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

A. Documents required at the time of filling Online Application Form

Foreign Nationals are required to upload the scanned copies of each of the following original documents while applying for admission to different programs (**NOTE: The candidate must upload all required scanned images/scanned copies only in .jpg format of 100 kb size per document**). The scanned copy should be of original document (and not of the photocopy) for verification by the departmental admission committee.

1. Marks Sheet (Transcripts) of Qualifying Examination
2. Valid Passport
3. IELTS Pass Certificate with 6 bands.
4. Fitness certificate by the Authorised/Registered Medical Practitioner that the candidate is not suffering from HIV and COVID-19.
5. Conduct and Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution from where the qualifying examination has been passed or from concerned Embassy
6. Photograph
7. Signature
8. Left hand thumb impression

B. Documents required on arrival of candidate at GU Campus

1. All uploaded original documents i.e. serial number 1 to 5 mentioned in A above
2. A valid student VISA in the name of GU, Gurugram
3. Equivalence Certificate from Association of Indian Universities (AIU) within a month of arrival to GU campus. If AIU does not issue equivalence certificate for specific program, the equivalency committee of GU considers such cases and decides accordingly.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

1. Please read the guidelines or procedure of admission before filling the **Online Application Form**.
2. Please write your correct name and surname in the application form. No change will be allowed later on.
3. All documents/transcripts need to be translated in English.
4. It is mandatory that the marksheet is attested by a Gazetted Officer/Notary or Indian Embassy of the concerned country.
5. It is mandatory for all students to produce the same documents in original at the time of arrival on the campus, as have been uploaded in the online admission form.
6. In case the documents, on the basis of which provisional admission is granted, are found to be fake at the time of submission, the provisional admission will be rejected and legal action will be taken under Indian Penal Code.
7. Fee, once paid, is not refundable.
8. Students will have to report to FRRO (Foreigner Regional Registration Office) within fourteen days of arrival and as and when necessary.
9. Students will not work with any Institute/Firm during the period of study.

IMPORTANT NOTES

1. Those who have done graduation or post-graduation shall not be eligible for admission to 5- year Integrated programs.
2. No applicant shall be permitted to pursue two regular programs simultaneously.
3. Rounding off of the decimal digits to a whole number for calculating the qualifying percentage of marks shall not be permissible in any case, whatsoever.
4. No migration will be allowed for foreign students.
5. Other rules and guidelines are to be followed as per GU main prospectus.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- **Who is a Foreign National?**

Candidate who holds a passport/citizenship of a country other than India.

Candidate who has an OCI (Overseas Citizen of India) /PIO (Person of Indian Origin) Card and also holds a passport of a country other than India.

- **Who is not a Foreign National?**

Non-Resident Indian (NRI).

Indian Citizen whose qualifying examination is from an International Board/Foreign University.

- All foreign national candidates who receive a provisional admission offer letter to any programme in the GU should obtain a valid **Student Visa/Research Visa** and bring all original documents to complete the admission process, without which no admission shall be granted. The Visa must be endorsed in the name of the Gurugram University, Gurugram. No other endorsement will be acceptable.

➤ **STUDENT VISA:** Student Visa is required to join Undergraduate Programme, Post-Graduate Programme, Certificate or Diploma Programme and M.Phil. Programme only.

➤ **RESEARCH VISA:** Research Visa is required only to join Ph.D. Programme.

Note: Admission will not be granted on Tourist Visa/X-Visa/Medical Visa.

- It is mandatory for all foreign candidates to get medical insurance policy with evacuation clause (wherever mandatory) for admission to any programme in the Gurugram University and also to continue the same during the entire tenure of their studies in the Gurugram University, Gurugram.
- The admission of foreign students will be made on merit on the basis of the qualifying examination. Foreign students are advised to apply through their own e mail ID and also use WhatsApp enabled mobile number.
- No request for any Change of Programme and /or College will be entertained after the completion of admission process.

- NOTE: 1. The students' conduct and disciplinary rules will be the same for International Students as given in main prospectus of GU. Any disciplinary action against the students will be handled by the concerned Chairpersons/Chief Warden/Proctorial Board as the case may be. If any disciplinary action is taken against the students, the same shall be intimated to the CIAA office for record purposes.**
- 2. University has not authorized any agent to act on its behalf. No Agents/Middlemen will be entertained.**

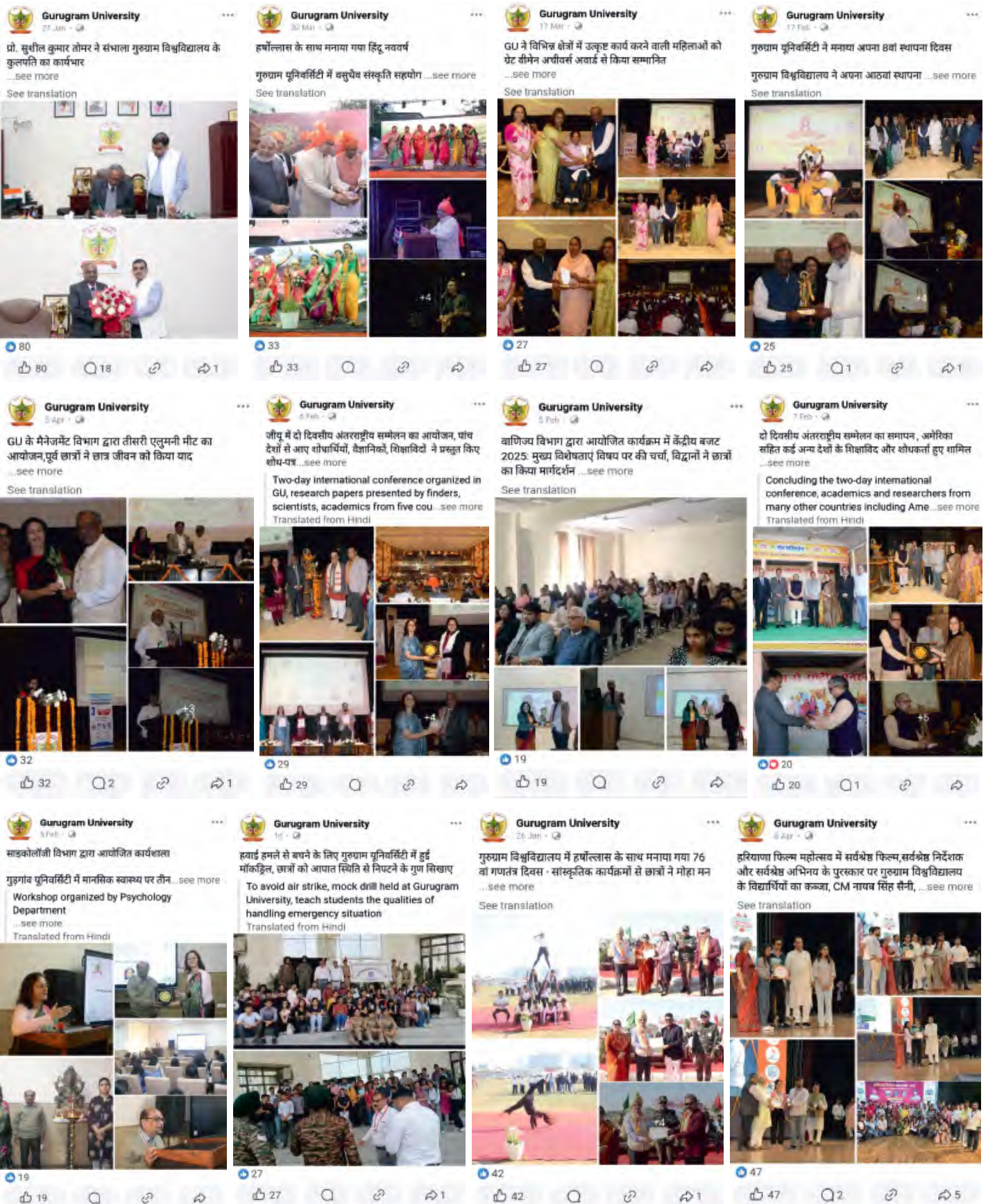

- **Students are advised to check the eligibility and admission criteria before filling the online forms.**
- **Classes for the existing students of UG and PG will commence from 16.07.2025 & 06.08.2025 respectively.**
- The student has to pay the fee semester wise (as mentioned in section 5 below) at the time of physical counseling. In case he/she did not deposit the same, the candidature will be offered to the next person in merit list/waiting list.
- Student who did not appear in First Physical counselling on the dates mentioned above or do not submit the fee after documents verification, his/her candidature will not be considered for 2nd merit list/2nd Physical counselling.

***Conditions for Open Counseling (If seats remains vacant after the 2nd Physical Counseling)**

- I. Each candidate may apply online for participation in open counseling (if any seat remains vacant) by making payment of requisite fee. The candidates who have previously applied and paid the requisite fee of application but could not get admission need not to pay the application fee again. The vacant seats will be allocated purely on the basis of merit (category wise). The schedule for open counseling will be notified by the departments on University website.
- II. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of BC(A) and BC(B), the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other category. For example, if any seat in BC(B) category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from BC(A) category and vice-versa in 1st Open Counseling (after second physical counseling).
- III. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of SC (O), the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other category. For example, if any seat in SC(O) category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from Deprived SC category and vice-versa in 1st Open Counseling (after second physical counseling).
- IV. If still the seats remain vacant, the vacant seats of reserved category will be converted into general category and will be filled accordingly in the open merit list, if no candidate of reserved category arrived during the open counseling. However, first priority will be given to him/her, if the candidate of reserved category is available, subject to eligibility and other conditions as mentioned in the Information Brochure on the basis of merit.

IMPORTANT POINTS FOR ADMISSION

1. Application form shall be submitted online only.
2. Students are advised to **check the eligibility, seat matrix, important points and admission criteria** before filling the online forms.
3. Documents to be attached/uploaded **must be scanned from original certificates** and should be clearly visible.
4. Application shall be considered only after uploading of mark-sheets of qualifying examination and payment of fee of application form. If any candidate wishes to apply for more than one academic program then he/she has to pay the separate fee for all the programs in which the candidate wants admission.
5. Candidates are suggested to check the University website and their emails regularly. All information will be sent on the candidate's email mentioned in his/her application form.
6. **The candidate whose name appears in the merit list has to appear for physical counseling in the concerned Department for the document verification. The selected candidate has to deposit fee online within stipulated time or else his/her seat will be considered vacant and seat shall be offered to the next candidate from the merit/waiting list.**
7. In case, there are less than 40% admission in a programme, the admission in such programme will not be made and the applicants will be given option to change to any other programme in the University subject to the eligibility and merit or for refund of fees. However, the Vice Chancellor may exempt the above condition on the recommendation of Chairperson of the Department.
8. The applicant of Haryana State has to provide the PPP ID for the online registration for the UTDs programme. The credentials of applicant (Name, Father's Name, DOB, Mother's Name, Family income etc.) shall be verified from the PPP as per provision of Haryana Parivar Pehchan Act, 2021. The applicant of Haryana State are advised to keep updating their PPP ID for the verification purpose and linked their mobile number with it.
9. If the applications in any of the program is received less than 75% of the sanctioned intake upto the last date, the status of such program will be placed before the admission committee for review.

- I. These seats are additional/supernumerary and will not be converted at all in any other category in case they remain unfilled. **Further, it is made clear that there is no provision for Supernumerary Seats in Programmes approved by regulatory bodies (BCI/PCI/AICTE/NCTE).**
- II. Eligibility conditions will be the same as applicable to the **General Category Candidates**.
- III. Additional/Supernumerary seats will be filled up as per norms, guidelines and eligibility prescribed by Gurugram University. The candidates seeking admission against these categories will have **to apply through separate online form** by the date notified in the schedule of admissions along with all documents testimonial and after that their provisional admission will be made on the basis of criteria mentioned in information brochure and checking of their uploaded documents by Admission Committee of department. Further, their admission will be confirmed by Physical Counselling and deposition of fee.

1. For Sports Persons

There will be one additional seat for Outstanding Sports Person in all courses over and above the sanctioned seats. Such candidates will have to submit a Grading Certificate issued by the **Director, Directorate of Sports and Youth Welfare, Government of Haryana, Chandigarh.**

The following will be the Criteria for admission to these seats, provided the candidate is otherwise eligible:

- a) 1st preference will be given to Sports Persons who have got positions (I /II /III) in an International Championship/ World cup/Olympics/Common Wealth Games/Asian Games.
- b) Candidate who represented India in the Tournaments mentioned in clause-a.
- c) Candidate who have won any positions (I/II/III) in All Indian Inter-University/Senior National Championship during Graduations. Events organized by Private Organizations/Associations will not be recognized for the purpose of admission.

2. For Single Girl Child

One seat in each course will be reserved for single girl child. The admission against this seat will be made on the basis of Merit as mentioned against the Programme in the information brochure. The students seeking admission under this category will be required to submit the following documents:

- a) An affidavit for only (single) girl child on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 50/- duly attested by first class magistrate.
- b) Copy of Parivar Pehchan Patra (PPP Id) and Ration Card along with the page where student's name mentioned (self- attested) Hindi or English version of the same, if the ration card is in any regional language. (In case of non-availability of Ration Card enclose a certificate from a local reputed person who knows your family very well).

3. For Students Excelling in Cultural Activities

One supernumerary seat in each course in the University Teaching Departments has been earmarked to promote cultural activities subject to the fulfilment of the following conditions:

- a) Any position in the National Youth Festival organized by the Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi or the first position holder in the North Zone Inter University Youth Festival organized by the Association of Indian Universities.
- b) Events organized by Private Organizations/Associations will not be recognized for the purpose of admission.

4. For Kashmiri Migrants

Two additional seats in each course offered in the University have been earmarked for Kashmiri Migrants as well as Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-migrant living in Kashmir valley).

In light of the directions, received from Department of Higher Education, MHRD, vide letter

No. 3-4/2017-NER dated 15.10.2019, it has been decided to allow the following concessions to the wards of Kashmiri Migrants as well as Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-migrant living in Kashmir valley) for admission to various programmes offered in the University Teaching Departments: -

1. Relaxation in cut off percentage upto 10%, subject to minimum eligibility conditions.
2. 5% increase in the intake capacity in each course offered.
3. No domicile certificate is required.
4. The University earmarks the seats reserved for the Jammu & Kashmir Migrants in a specific programme of study at the time of counseling as per current practice. If any guidelines are received from the Government before the commencement of counseling for the academic session 2025-26, the same shall be applied.

5. Gurugram University, Gurugram Employee Ward

One supernumerary seat for wards of Gurugram University, Gurugram regular employees has been earmarked over and above the sanctioned seats for admission to various Programmes (excluding M.Phil/Ph.D.) being run in the University Teaching Departments.

6. For Foreign Candidates

15% additional supernumerary seats for foreign candidates out of which 1/3rd seats (5% of total intake) have been earmarked for the children of Indian workers in the Gulf Countries and South Asia. These seats will not be filled, if such foreign candidates are not available. Refer section 4 for other details about admission of foreign students.

7. For NRI Candidates

10% seats over and above the existing sanctioned intake are meant for actual NRI candidates and their children or wards in all programmes. The following categories of students are considered to be Non-Resident Indian for taking admission in GU, Gurugram:

- a) Actual NRI
- b) At least one of the parents of such students should be an NRI and shall ordinarily be residing abroad as an NRI.
- c) NRI sponsoring a student for admission should be a first degree relation of the student and should be ordinarily residing abroad as an NRI. First degree relation would include real brother and sister over and above the mother-father.
- d) If the student has no parents or near relatives, or taken as a ward by some other nearest relative such students also may be considered for admission provided the guardian has bonafide treated the student as a ward and such guardian shall file an affidavit indicating the interest shown in the affairs of the students and also his relationship with the student and such person also should be an NRI, and ordinarily residing abroad.

Following will be covered under this category:

- i) Real brother and sister of father i.e. real uncle and real aunt.
- ii) Real brother and sister of mother i.e. real maternal uncle and maternal aunt.
- iii) Father and mother of father i.e. grandfather and grandmother.

- iv) Father and mother of mother i.e. maternal grandfather and maternal grandmother.

Admission against seats reserved for NRI candidates will be made in the above manner in order of priority. The following documents will be required for admission against these seats:

- i) Original Certificate/Mark Sheet of qualifying examination.
- ii) Attested copies of Passport and Visa of the applicant/parent.
- iii) Foreign Bank Account No. or NRI Account No. of the applicant/parent.
- iv) Declaration regarding Non-Resident Indian status of the applicant/parent.

(Appendix-N).

Once a candidate is admitted to a programme as an NRI candidate, he/she will remain in this category for the full duration of the programme. The decision of the University regarding status of foreign/NRI candidate will be final.

8. Defense Personnel

Supernumerary seats are reserved for Defense Personnel deputed by Director General Military Training, New Delhi.

9. Centre and State Govt. Nominated/Sponsored Personnel

One supernumerary seat for Centre and State Govt. nominated/sponsored personnel has been earmarked over and above the sanctioned seats for admission to various PG programmes (excluding M.Phil/Ph.D.) being run in the University Teaching Departments.

10. For Orphan Children

Two supernumerary seats (01 for male and 01 for female) has been earmarked over and above the sanctioned seats in every Academic UG/PG programmes except those running under regulatory bodies (BCI, PCI, NCT, COP).

11. For the wards of the residents of the villages who donated land to the University

One supernumerary seat in all academic programmes except the programme approved by regulatory bodies provisioned for admission for the wards of the residents of the villages who donated the land to the University.

Note:

1. Admission to these programmes against the supernumerary seats shall be made by the **Admission Committee of the concerned Department** as per given schedule.
2. The decision of the Admission Committee in all matters relating to the admissions shall be final.

4.5 GENERAL GUIDELINES AND INFORMATION FOR ADMISSION

The following procedure shall be followed for selection of the candidates for admission to various programmes:

1. Before filling the Admission Application Form, the candidates are required to read the information brochure/guidelines/ instructions available on University website carefully. Candidates will submit their Application Forms online on the University website: www.gurugramuniversity.ac.in for admission to various programmes and print out of admission application form filled in online alongwith Xerox copies of relevant documents and receipt of fee, should be submitted during the physical counseling. The candidate has to bring the original documents for verification.
2. The processing charges for the application form for admission are **Rs. 1000/- for General Category and Rs. 250/- for Scheduled Caste ,Backward Class of Haryana, differently abled persons and Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) of Haryana.**
3. A Candidate may apply for admission to as many programmes as he/she wants. Separate application form for admission to each additional programme shall be required to be filled online after paying of Rs. 1000/- for General Category and Rs. 250/- for Scheduled Caste, Backward Class of Haryana, differently abled persons and Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) of Haryana per programme.
4. The minimum eligibility and number of seats for admission to various courses will remain same as per Information Brochure 2025-26. Kindly visit University Website for more details and changes/updation (if any).
5. The SC/ST/BC candidates belonging to the States other than Haryana will be treated as General Category candidates for all purposes.
6. The candidates claiming the benefit of reservation shall upload/submit a certificate from the competent authority. Refer to Appendices "**C to K1**" for instructions and formats of various certificates.
7. The candidates with re-appear(s) in the qualifying examination shall not be allowed admission to UG/PG Programmes.
8. In PG admissions, if result of final semester of candidate is not declared upto last date of submission of online examination forms, merit shall be prepared on the basis of total marks obtained upto pre-final examinations. In this case candidate shall fill up total marks obtained upto prequalifying examination, in the online form.
9. The scanned copies of **original certificates/testimonials (not of photocopy)** of all the examinations passed by the candidate from 10th standard onwards/other documents including documents for claiming reservation and latest Character Certificate should be uploaded on the website (in .jpeg or pdf format only) while filling online application form.

10. Incomplete/incorrect application form shall be rejected, summarily. The Admission Committee of the concerned department will check the eligibility of the candidates. The Committee shall have the power to reject any certificate not considered valid. In case, the candidate is not found eligible, his/her candidature will be cancelled.
11. For conversion of CGPA to percentage marks wherever applicable, the candidates are required to fill up the percentage of marks secured in each examination using the formula given by examining body.
12. Rounding off the decimal digits to a whole number for calculating the percentage of marks shall not be permissible in any case, whatsoever.
13. The Candidates are advised to fill up all the details carefully. No change will be allowed after submission of application form.
14. The merit list for admission to the **programmes will be prepared by the Departments/Institutes of the University as per guidelines/instructions** given in the information brochure/notification.
15. As per guidelines of Higher Education Department issued vide memo No. 15/1-2020 NSS (2) dated 10.05.2023 the additional 5 marks will be awarded to the NSS Merit Certificate holder volunteers during the under graduate courses/classes admission process from the academic session 2025-26. **The additional 5 marks will only be awarded if the candidate ensure his/her admission through the eligible criteria of merit basis and not applicable to the candidates of CUET basis admissions.**
16. If during the preparation of merit lists, admission committee of concerned Department finds any discrepancy, the admission form may be rejected directly or an email may be sent to the candidate for online resubmission of document within given duration of time.
17. If two or more candidates secure identical merit, then the candidate senior in age will be given preference. In case if date of birth is same then the marks obtained in next lower class will be considered.
18. The merit lists will be displayed on the University website as per the schedule mentioned in information brochure or displayed on website. No separate communication shall be sent in this regard.
19. The candidate whose name appears in the merit list has to appear for physical counseling in the concerned Department for the document verification. If, the candidate selected he/she has to deposit fee online or at the University fee counter within stipulated time or else his/her seat will be considered vacant and seat shall be offered to the next candidate from the merit list.

20. The vacant seats after 2nd physical counselling by adopting the following provisions:-
- i. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of BC(A) and BC(B), the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other category. For example, if any seat in BC(B) category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from BC(A) category and vice-versa in 2nd physical counselling.
 - ii. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of SC, the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other category. For example, if any seat in SC category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from Deprived SC category and vice-versa in 2nd physical counselling.
21. In case, after Physical counseling, the seat(s) of various reserved categories remain vacant and no eligible candidate of the reserved categories is available then the vacant seats may be thrown open to Haryana General Category/AIO category in next merit list as per rules of the University with the permission of Vice Chancellor.
22. Mere possession of the prescribed academic qualifications does not entitle a candidate for admission to the programme. Candidates would be required to fulfil all the conditions as spelt out in the information brochure.
23. The eligibility of the candidates shall be ascertained at the time of preparing merit list however the admission seekers are required to ensure that they possess the prescribed qualification for the programme they are seeking admission.
24. If the concerned authorities are not satisfied with the character / past behavior / antecedents of a candidate, they may refuse to admit him/her to any course of study in the University/College in order to ensure academic standards, discipline and peaceful atmosphere in the University. The Vice Chancellor may cancel the admission of any student for a specified period.
25. In case any candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him/her, which is found to be incorrect or false at a later stage, his/her admission will be cancelled and all fees and other dues paid by him/her shall be forfeited. The University/Institute may also take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate and his/her guardian.
26. All admissions are provisional subject to verifications of documents and approval of Competent Authority.
27. The rules relating to anti-ragging, their behavior on the Campus and the Hostels as framed by the University will be applicable and binding on all students.
28. In case, there are less than 50% admission in a programme the admission in such programme will not be made and the applicants will be given option to change to any other programme in the University subject to the eligibility and merit or for refund of fees. However, Vice Chancellor may exempt the above condition on the recommendation of Chairperson of the Department.

HOSTEL FACILITY

The Hostel accommodation to the admitted girls' students of UTDs shall be provided in the Hostel/PG outside the University campus.

INTERPRETATION

For any kind of dispute originated due to non-availability of rules/regulations or interpretation of rules/ regulations adopted during admission, the decision of Vice Chancellor will be final.

LEGAL JURISDICTION

All disputes pertaining to admissions shall fall within the jurisdiction of Gurugram Only.

4.6 ADMISSION PROCESS

4. Change in programme or category, once opted for the purpose of admission, will not be allowed.
5. The Candidate shall be personally responsible in case, he/she is not eligible to apply as per the given eligibility criteria.
6. **Application fee is non-refundable.**

5.3 OTHER RULES AND GUIDELINES RELATING TO FEE STRUCTURE.

- A. Examination fee is included in annual fees which is to be deposited online through Debit Card/ Net Banking at the time of admission for all programmes.
- B. A candidate will submit his/her Annual fee during first year of the course and may be semester-wise for rest of the semesters/course.
- C. The candidates of paramedical and diploma programmes may submit his/her fee semester wise (except Department of Physiotherapy).**
- D. The students will deposit the fee on fixed time and the Chairperson will not allow to any student to attend the class without depositing the fee. The attendance marked without deposit of fee will be treated as illegal and will not be counted for the purpose of attendance.
- E. Fee will be charged from the students as per the fee structure given in the information brochure of each academic programme.
- F. Dues must be paid on the dates notified; otherwise a late fee fine shall be charged as follows:

- G. If the admission of a student is cancelled by the University for no fault of his/her, the fees and other dues paid by him will be refunded except the Admission Fee, provided the application to this effect duly recommended by the Chairperson of the department is received in the University Office within one month of the date of the letter conveying the cancellation of admission. The application for the refund of dues submitted beyond the time limit prescribed above may be considered with permission of the Vice-Chancellor on merit.

5.4 FEE REFUND POLICY

In case of withdrawal of admission, the candidates has to submit the application alongwith relevant documents for refund of fee in prescribed proforma (**Appendix-R**) through the Chairperson of the concerned department

- The **PPP ID** will be mandatory for all such cases of fee concession.
- The process for obtaining the approval of the competent authority may be completed by the respective **Chairperson(s) of the UTDs within two weeks from the date of admission covered under above clauses but before submission of Registration Return**. In case the application of the students is not considered/accepted by the competent authority due to any reason, the students(s) will be informed by the respective department to deposit the fee within a week's time from the date of rejection of his request.

5.6 BENEFITS OF FEE FOR CANDIDATES OF HARYANA BELONGING TO THE SCHEDULED CASTE CATEGORY

There is a Post Matric Scholarship Scheme of GOI for welfare of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste Category. As per letter No.3/44-2012 Sch. (2) dated 18.06.2013 of the Director General Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula. Such students, whose parents/guardian income is upto Rs. 2.50 lakh per annum, are eligible for benefits under the said scheme. The benefits include enrollment/registration, tuition, games, union, library, magazine, Medical Examination and such other fees compulsorily payable by the student to the institution or University/Board. Refundable deposit like caution money, security deposit are, however, excluded. For students admitted under this scheme, the application form has to be submitted by the students to the concerned Chairperson/Director of the Department/ Institute.

Note:

An income declaration shall be furnished by the self-employed parents/guardian. Employed parents are required to obtain income certificates from their employer and for any additional income from other sources; they would furnish declaration by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper.

- No fee will be charged by the University from the students belonging to the Scheduled Caste Category, whose parent's Income is upto Rs. 2.50 lakh p.a. They shall be admitted during the academic session 2025-26 as per instructions of the Director Higher Education, Haryana and the Director General, Technical Education Department, Panchkula, Haryana. However, as per instructions dated 01.09.2018 of the Director, Welfare of SC/BC Classes Department Haryana, Chandigarh, the students belonging to the Scheduled Caste Category who after verification of record by the office are found eligible for the PMS Scholarship, shall have to submit an undertaking in the Fee Section of the Accounts Branch that they will deposit their fee immediately to the institution as soon as they receive the Scholarship in their bank account.
- Students belonging to the Scheduled Caste category who are eligible for Post Matric Scholarship Scheme should get their Saving Bank Account linked with Aadhaar Number to get transferred the funds in their respective bank accounts.
- Students, who are eligible for Scheduled Caste and Backward Class Scholarship(s) as the case may be, shall apply online on the dates which will be announced/published in the newspapers/website of hryscbcschemes.in/harchhatravatti.highereduhry.ac.in/ portal by the State Govt. /Funding Agencies.
- Instructions received from the State Government from time to time on this issue shall be followed.
The Library Security amounting to **Rs. 1500/-** or any other refundable security be charged from SC students and may be refunded after the completion of the Programme in case the applicant submits a No Dues Certificate.

Note:

The SC student claiming zero fee admission must submit an undertaking/affidavit stating that he/she will deposit the full annual fee incase State Govt. does not provide the scholarship **(Annexure T)**.

Note:

It is mandatory to maintain a Roster Register at Departmental level for distribution and reservation of seats.

In the event of quota reserved for Physically Handicapped remain unutilized due to non-availability for suitable category of Handicapped Candidates, it may be offered to the Ex-Servicemen and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%). Further, 3% reservation is also provided to Ex-servicemen/ Freedom Fighters and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of General Category, 1% out of Scheduled Caste and 1% from Backward Classes category for admission to the various educational institutions of the Govt. and Govt. aided / Institutes located in Haryana. As far as Block allocation in Block-A and Block-B of Backward Classes category is concerned year wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block-A of Backward Classes are given seats in academic year 2018, the next Block i.e., (B) Block of Category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year 2019 and so on. Further, a roster register for reservation of seats for ex-servicemen/freedom fighters shall be maintained and carry forward all fractions, till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the years. As and when the total comes to one, a seat will be provided.

Fifty percent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived Scheduled Castes as enumerated in the **Appendix-J**.

Where a seat is set aside for candidate from the deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government Educational Institution is not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidate of the deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualification, the same shall be made available to the candidate of Schedule Castes.

6.2 GUIDELINES FOR RESERVATION

- I. **The reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of Haryana Govt. and is subject to change/amendment made by the State Govt. from time to time.**
- II. Candidates belonging to SC/ST are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-C**. The list of Others Scheduled Castes and Deprived Scheduled Caste notified by the Haryana Government is available at **Appendix-J** respectively.
- III. Candidates belonging to Backward Classes are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-D**. The list of Backward Classes in Haryana notified by the Haryana Government is available at **Appendix-H**. Circular no. 1170SW(I)-95 dated 7.6.95 of the Haryana Govt. for excluding Socially

Advanced Persons/Sections (Creamy Layer} from Backward Classes maybe referred to at **Appendix-I**.

- IV. The children or Grand Children (Maternal and Paternal) of Freedom Fighters are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-E**.
- V. Children or Wards of Military Personnel (including personnel of Para-Military Forces killed in Action or Permanently Disabled in Action and Boarded Out from the Services or Ex- Servicemen and their wards will be considered for reservation. They will submit a certificate as per **Appendix-F**. The following categories of personnel of Territorial Army are included in the definition of Ex- Servicemen in terms of the State Govt. letter No. 12/18/2006 GS-11 dated 8- 01-2008:
- Pension holders for continuous embodied service;
 - Persons with disability attributable to military service;
 - Gallantry Award Winners; and
 - Such recruits boarded out/released on medical grounds and granted medical/disability pension.
- VI. Only those candidates who have permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the programme) will be considered for admission as Physically Handicapped. They will submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-G**. Disability Certificate shall, however, be subject to verification by a Medical Board to be constituted by the University. The decision of Medical Board in this regard shall be final.
- VII. A candidate who applies for a reserved category or for both reserved and general categories will be considered first in general category. In case, he is not selected in general category, he will be considered for reserved category. The Scheduled Castes/Backward Classes candidates who get selected /admitted in open competition on the basis of their own merit, will not be counted against the quota reserved for scheduled caste/ backward classes, rather they will be treated as open competition candidates. However, such candidates shall fulfill condition of eligibility regarding age etc. as are meant for general category candidates (Memo No.13864-75 dated 24.8.2012 received from the Principal Secretary to Govt. of Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Caste and Backward Classes, Department, Chandigarh).
- VIII. If a candidate belongs to more than one reserved category, he/she shall be required to give his/her preference at the time of filling up the admission form. Preference once given shall not be changed.
- IX. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of BC(A) and BC(B), the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other category. For example, if any seat in BC(B) category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from BC(A) category and vice-versa.

- X. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of SC, the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other category. For example, if any seat in SC category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from Deprived SC category and vice-versa.
- XI. After physical counseling, the vacant seats will be converted into general category seats and will be filled accordingly in the open merit list.
- XII. Proforma for Economically Weaker Section of income & asset certificate issued by Government of Haryana dated 13.03.2019 as per **Appendix-K1**.
- XIII. The application form for fee concession is at **Appendix-U**.

SECTION 7: GENERAL RULES

7.1 General Rules

1. The candidates seeking admission on Haryana Open General seats are required to submit certificate of bonafide residents of Haryana as defined by the Haryana Govt. **(Appendix-A)**. The Certificate of Haryana Resident shall be in the formats prescribed by the Govt. and issued by the competent authority **(Appendices A1-4)**.
2. A candidate who has passed his/her qualifying examination from a University/College situated within the State of Haryana will be deemed to be Haryana resident and will be required to submit certificate of bonafide resident of Haryana issued by the Principal/Headmaster of the Institution last attended **(Appendix- A3)**.
3. Reservation of seats for various categories shall be determined by the criteria given in the Section 6 Distribution & Reservation of Seats in Various Programmes.
4. A complete merit list of all eligible candidates will be prepared for each category.
5. The candidates having passed qualifying examination from the self-styled Universities/ Institutes/Boards, declared bogus/fake by the UGC and other Govt. Bodies, shall not be eligible for admission to any programme in GUG. The list of such Universities/ Institutes/ Boards is available at **Appendix-M**. This list may vary from time to time as per notification of UGC/other Govt. bodies.
6. The list of examinations of various Indian/Foreign Universities/Boards recognized by this University and Board of School Education, Bhiwani, Haryana is available with the Departments / Institutes/ Academic Branch of this University and also on University Website. This list shall be referred to for verification of the documents of the candidates seeking admission to this University. No candidate who has passed his/her qualifying/other examination(s) from the Universities / Boards /Institutes other than mentioned in the list referred above shall be admitted without verification from the Academic Branch or Registration& Scholarship Branch.
7. Any attempt on the part of a candidate, his/her friends or relatives to canvass or bring influence to bear upon the University directly or indirectly for securing admission will lead to disqualification for admission.
8. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of information submitted by him/her but at any subsequent time, it is discovered that any portion of this information is incorrect or false, the student shall be removed from the University and all fees and other dues paid till the date of such removal shall be forfeited. The University may take any further action it may deem fit against the said student and his/her guardian.

9. In case of any ambiguity in the rules, interpretation of the same by the Vice Chancellor shall be final.
10. All the admitted candidates should apply for the Identity-cum-Library Membership Card through the respective HOD/Director of the Institute.
11. No student shall be deemed to have pursued a regular programme of study unless he/she has attended **not less than 65% or 75%** of the lectures delivered in theory as well as practical as per concerned Ordinance. Relaxation in shortage of **lectures upto 20%** will be allowed by the Head of the Department/Director on the grounds detailed in the concerned Ordinances. The name of a student remaining absent for 15 consecutive days (excluding Sunday/Holiday) after the start or during the academic session without any notice shall be struck off from the rolls of the Department/Institute. A fine of **Rs.5/-** per lecture/day shall be charged on account of remaining absent from the classes. However, re-admission may be allowed on payment of **Rs.1000/-** alongwith required fine within **15 days** with the permission of the Dean Academic Affairs. If a student fails to report within this time limit, the seat will be declared vacant to be filled according to University rules. Re-admission may be allowed by the Dean Academic Affairs only once on the recommendations of the concerned Head of the Department/Director on payment of prescribed re-admission fee. However, while giving his/her specific recommendations, the concerned Head of the Department/Director must ensure that the student will fulfill the minimum requirement of attendance for appearing in the examinations as per concerned Ordinance.
12. The student of UTD should apply for '**No Dues**' before the examinations.
13. A student, who had been detained on account of shortage of attendance, his/her name is struck off from the department, may be re-admitted provided:
- (a) he/she seeks re-admission within the prescribed date in the relevant semester
 - (b) his/her conduct has been satisfactory; and he/she shows sufficient cause to the satisfaction of the University for not having put in the requisite percentage of attendance in lectures.
 - (c) Such a student will not be promoted to the next semester till he/she completes the requirements as mentioned in (a) and (b) above in the preceding semester. Supernumerary seat (s) be created for readmitting such students in the corresponding semester. However, such students will have to pay fee being charged from the students of that semester. If such a student had been detained in 1st semester of a programme, he/she may be re-admitted next year without competing with the other students seeking admission to the **1st Semester**.
14. An applicant who fails in the examination, or fails to appear in the examination, and who is otherwise eligible to appear in the examination as an ex-student, shall not be admitted as regular student. In exceptional cases, however, where such an applicant is a foreigner studying under the Cultural Scholarship Scheme of the Govt. of India etc., re-admission may be allowed.

15. In respect of an applicant seeking re-admission, his/her previous record shall be carefully scrutinized and the decision of the Vice Chancellor in this regard shall be final.
16. Casual admission will not be allowed under any circumstances.
17. The medium of instruction shall be Hindi in case of Hindi subject and English in case of other subjects except where Hindi is specifically prescribed as medium of instruction.
18. Applicants should satisfy themselves about their eligibility before applying for any programme.
19. No plea about the ignorance of the rules and regulations and other provisions of admission will be entertained.
20. As regards the rules of promotion etc., students will be governed by the provisions of the University ordinances.
21. All the rules and regulations for submission of migration certificate by the candidates, who have passed the lower examinations from other Universities/Boards, will be applicable as per the University Rules.
22. Always quote your Application Form No. & Fee Receipt No. for reference while making correspondence regarding admission to the programmes offered by this University.
23. Ordinarily the odd and even semester examinations shall be held in December/January and May/June, respectively every year. However, the schedule may change due to some compelling circumstances.
24. Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited in the Departments/Administrative Block/Library.
25. Entire University campus is a No Smoking Zone. Smoking is a punishable offence and strictly prohibited.
26. Parents are advised to visit the University from time to time to keep themselves abreast of the progress of their wards.
27. While pursuing professional programme, the students may have to go for Industry exposure/field-trips as per programme requirements.
28. Optional paper (s) can be offered with the permission of the Vice Chancellor, if the student strength is less than five.
29. If gap in studies, students may give reasons with documentary proof/self-undertaking.

30. Nothing contained in this information brochure shall be construed to convey sanction or cited as an authority for which University regulations alone are applicable.

31. Grant of Maternity Leave to the women students for various UG/PG Programmes.

- a) The women students will be entitled to avail the Maternity Leave for a period not exceeding 45 days continuously in a single stretch with the prior permission of the Head/Director of the concerned Department/Institute and the Principal of the College on production of valid Medical Certificate. The leave period may be excluded from the total lectures delivered during the semester. But the concerned student has to appear in all the Minor/Major Examinations etc. as per Schedule notified by the department of the University,
- b) However, if so desired, the student may drop the full semester but she has to complete the attendance of that drop out semester after appearing in the final semester examination and shall have to appear in the drop out semester examinations according to the Even & Odd Semester policy. In such cases, she will not be required to pay the readmission fee and the entire semester fee (if she has already paid the drop out semester fee) to complete the attendance of the drop out semester. The above decision shall be applicable to all the UG/PG Programmes being run in the affiliated colleges and University Teaching Departments.

Note:

It is mandatory to maintain a Roster Register at Departmental level for distribution and reservation of seats.

7.2 STUDENTS CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE RULES

1. Application of Rules:

These rules shall apply to all the students of Gurugram University, Gurugram.

2. Acts of Indiscipline and Misconduct:

Any act of misconduct committed by a student inside or outside the campus shall be an act of violation of discipline of the University. Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provision, violation of the discipline shall include:

- i. Disruption of teaching, study, examination, research or administrative work, curricular or extra-curricular activity or residential life of the members of the University, including any attempt to prevent any member of the University or its staff from carrying on his or her work and doing any act reasonably likely to cause such disruption.
- ii. Damaging or defacing University property or the property of the members of the University or any other property inside or outside the University Campus.
- iii. Engaging in any attempt as wrongful confinement of teachers, officers, employees and students of the University or camping inside or creating nuisance inside the boundaries of houses of teachers, officers and other members of the University.

- iv. Use of abusive and derogatory slogans or intimidating language or incitement of hatred and violence or any act calculated to further the same.
- v. Smoking in the University Campus.
- vi. Eve-teasing and/or disrespectful behaviour towards girl students and women.
- vii. Any assault upon or intimidation of or insulting behaviour towards a teacher, officer, employee or student or any other person.
- viii. Causing or colluding in the unauthorized entry of any person in the campus or in the unauthorized occupation of any portion of University premises, including Hostels or Halls of Residence, by any person.
- ix. Getting enrolled in more than one programme of study simultaneously in violation of University rules.
- x. Committing forgery, tampering with or misuse of University documents or records, identification cards etc.
- xi. Furnishing false certificate or false information to any office under the control and jurisdiction of the University.
- xii. Consuming or possessing alcoholic drinks, dangerous drugs or other intoxicants in the University premises.
- xiii. Indulging in acts of gambling in the University premises.
- xiv. Possessing or using weapons such as knives, lathis, iron chains, iron rods, sticks, explosives and fire arms in the University premises.
- xv. Arousing communal, caste or regional feelings or creating disharmony among students
- xvi. Not disclosing one's identity when asked to do so by an employee or officer of the University who is authorized to ask for identity.
- xvii. Tearing of pages, defacing, burning or destroying books etc. of library.
- xviii. Unauthorized occupation of Hostel Rooms or unauthorized use of University furniture in one's Hostel Room or elsewhere.
- xix. Accommodating guests or other persons in Hostel without permission of the competent authority.
- xx. Improper rendering of accounts for money drawn from or through any office under the control and jurisdiction of the University.

- xxi. Coercing the medical staff to render medical assistance to persons not entitled for the same or any other disorderly behavior
- xxii. Any act of moral turpitude
 - a. Any offence under law
 - b. Committing any of the offences specified in the examination rules of the University (Control of unfair means and disorderly conduct)
 - c. Violation of Traffic Rules in the University premises
 - d. Pasting of posters, distributing of pamphlets, handbills etc. of objectionable nature or writing on walls and disfiguring buildings
 - e. Any other act considered by the Vice-Chancellor or the Discipline Committee to be an act of violation of discipline.

3. Disciplinary Action

Without any prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor as specified in Statutes of University, the following Officers are authorized to take disciplinary action by way of imposing penalties as specified in Clause 4 of these regulations other than those specified in Sub-Clause (ix), (x), (xi), (xii), (xiii) & (xiv):

- i) Proctor
- ii) Deans of the Faculties/Dean, Students Welfare
- iii) Chief Warden(Boys/Girls)
- iv) Heads of the Departments
- v) Principals / Directors of the Colleges/Institutions
- vi) Any other person employed by the University and authorized by the Vice-Chancellor for the purpose provided that the penalties on the offences relating to Examinations will be dealt with by the relevant bodies.

4. Nature of Penalties

The following penalties may, for acts of indiscipline or misconduct or for good and sufficient reasons, be imposed on a student, namely:

- i) Written warning and information to the guardian.
- ii) Fine as may be warranted by the nature of case.
- iii) Suspension from the Class/ Department/ College/ Hostel/ Mess/ Library or withdrawal of any other facility of this nature.
- iv) Suspension or cancellation of scholarships, fellowships or any financial assistance from any source, or recommendation to that effect to the sanctioning agency.
- v) Recovery of pecuniary loss caused to University property.

- vi) Debarring from participation in Sports/NCC/NSS and other such activities.
- vii) Disqualifying from holding any representative position in the Class/College/ Hostel/ Mess/Sports/Clubs and in similar other bodies.
- viii) Hostel shift and Hall shift.
- ix) Expulsion from the Department/ Faculty/ Hostel/ Mess/ Library/ Clubs for a specified period.
- x) Debarring from an examination.
- xi) Non-issue of Migration Certificate.
- xii) Expulsion from the University for a Specified Period.
- xiii) Disqualifying from further studies, or prohibition for future admission or readmission.
- xiv) Any student against whom an allegation of misconduct has been made may be suspended from the rolls of the University by the Vice-Chancellor, pending enquiry or pending trial on a cognizable offence by a court of Law.

5. Opportunity to be given before Award of Penalty

No penalty, provided in sub-clauses (ix), (x), (xi), (xii), (xiii) and (xiv) of Clause 4 shall be imposed without giving to the student a reasonable opportunity of being heard.

6. Review of Appeal against the Penalty

A review would lie to the Officer issuing the orders within seven days, and an appeal would lie against the orders of the authorities mentioned in these rules (except the Vice- Chancellor) to the Proctorial Board of the University. The Board may also review its decision on its own.

7. Prohibition of Ragging

"The instructions for curbing ragging as conveyed by the UGC vide letter No. 1- 15/2009 (ARC) pt. III dated 17.03.2017, in view of the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 08.05.2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009 and also given in Chapter X be adhered to strictly (UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Education Institutions, 2009, UGC website: www.ugc.ac.in & the Haryana Prohibition of Ragging in Educational Institution Ordinance 2012)":

Ragging in educational institutions is banned and any one indulging in ragging is likely to be punished appropriately. The punishment may include

expulsion/suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology. The punishment may also take shape of (i) withholding or withdrawing scholarships or fellowships and other benefits (ii) forfeiting campus placement opportunities or recommendations. (iii) debarring from appearing in any test or examination or other evaluation process (iv) debarring from representing the educational institution in any reasonable, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc. (v) withholding results (vi) suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess (vii) cancellation of admission (viii) lodging of FIR with the local police. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not/cannot be identified, collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent. Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other students, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear apprehension thereof in fresher or junior students or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such students will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame of embarrassment so as to adversely effect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student or any type of abuse through electronic media or wrongful confinement, use of criminal force, assault as well as sexual offence, trespass, defamation or threat to defame will be deemed an act of ragging. Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in SPL (C) No. 24295/2004 in the matter of University of Kerala V/s Council of Principals, Colleges of Kerala and others has ordered that if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain to if his/ her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him/her from the Institution. The applicants at the time of admission are required to give an undertaking (Appendix- O & P) against ragging.

8. Check on the menace of sexual harassment and violence against women

The University has a zero tolerance policy towards the act of sexual harassment. Sexual harassment is taken as a serious act of indiscipline. A Committee, constituted by the Vice-Chancellor under the Chairpersonship of a senior female professor/Associate Professor, will check the menace of sexual harassment and violence against girl students and women. The Sexual Harassment|| includes any unwelcome sexually determined behaviour, whether directly or by implication and includes physical contact and advances, a demand or request for sexual favours, sexually-coloured remarks, showing pornography or any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature. The Committee shall take all precautionary measures to prevent sexual harassment and violence against girl students and women in the University. It shall also ensure that there is no hostile environment towards girl students and women. No girl student should have reasonable ground to believe that she is at a disadvantage or is being discriminated against. If any complaint of sexual harassment comes to the notice of the Committee, immediate disciplinary action alongwith appropriate action in accordance with the law would be taken.

Copy of letter No.62/17/95-6 GSI dated 3.10.96 from the Chief Secretary to Govt., Haryana, Chandigarh and addressed to all Heads of Departments, Commissioners, Ambala, Rohtak, Gurugram and Hisar Division, All Deputy Commissioners & all Sub-Divisional Officers in Haryana, Registrar, Punjab and Haryana High Court and all District Sessions Judges in Haryana.

Subject: Bonafide Residents of Haryana - Guidelines regarding

Sir,

- I. I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institutions (including technical/medical institutions). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pardeep Jain Vs Union of India and others reported as AIR1984-SC-1421, where in it has been held that instead of word Domicile, the word Resident be used in the instructions issued by the State Government, and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate:-
 - I. Candidates who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana;
 - II. Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants:
 - a) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or Working on deputation;
 - b) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/Corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana;
 - c) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government.
 - III. Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons who, after retirement, have permanently settled in Haryana, and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the state of Haryana.
 - IV. Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of pensioners of Haryana Govt., irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than

Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;

- V. Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of persons who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
 - VI. The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
 - VII. Children/wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognized by Govt. of Haryana (added vide C.S. letter No. 62/27/2003-6 GSI dated 29/7/2003)
 - VIII. Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; Provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are:
 - a) citizens of India;
 - b) produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants have not obtained the benefit of domicile in any other State.
1. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub Divisional Officer (Civil), Tehsildar (Revenue Department of the District/Sub Division to which the candidates belong). Resident Certificate in respect of the children/wards/dependants of Haryana Government employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of the children/wards/dependants of the employees of the statutory bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana and located at Chandigarh, in Haryana or outside Haryana, should be issued by their respective Heads of Departments.
 2. Candidates, seeking admission in educational institutions (including Medical and Technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Head Master from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Head Master of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate which should be sufficient.
 3. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana, but at any subsequent time, it is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, and all fees and other dues paid upto the date of such removal shall be confiscated. Principal/Head Master may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians, as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
 4. These instructions may kindly be noted carefully for compliance.

Note :

1. The State Government, vide letter no. 22/28/2003-3GS-III dated 30.1.2004, has decided that henceforth Circle Revenue Officers (Tehsildar/NaibTehsildar-cumExecutive Magistrate concerned has been authorized to issue Resident as well as Caste Certificates (SC/BC/OBC). In case of Haryana Govt. employees serving in the offices located at Chandigarh/Panchkula and residing at Chandigarh/Panchukula, the Resident Certificate and Caste Certificates to SC/BC employees and their children will be issued by their respective Heads of the Departments. The proforma for these certificates have also been prescribed by the State Govt. (Appendix-A-I, B & C). Therefore, all the candidates will be required to submit such certificates in the prescribed proforma. The certificate issued by anyone other than the competent authority in the proforma other than the prescribed proforma will not be accepted.
2. Haryana Resident Certificate should be of the date of 30.01.2004 or after. Certificates issued before this date will not be accepted. The candidates must ensure that they get Haryana Resident Certificates and not Haryana Domicile Certificate from the appropriate authority as Haryana Domicile Certificate is invalid for the purpose of admission.

Copy of letter No. 1170-SW (I)-95 dated 7.6.95 received from the Commissioner and Secretary to Government, Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, Haryana, Chandigarh, addressed to all Heads of Departments, Commissioners, Ambala, Hisar, Rohtak: and Gurgaon Divisions, all Deputy Commissioners and Sub Divisional Officers in Haryana and Registrar, Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh.

Sub: Exclusion of socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that following the Supreme Court judgment in the Indira Sawhney and others versus Union of India case, the Haryana Government vide notification dated 12.10.1993 had set up the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission. The terms of reference of this Commission were to entertain, examine and recommend upon requests for inclusion and complaints of over- inclusion and under-inclusion in the list of Backward Classes. Vide notification dated 26-5-1994, the Commission was also assigned the function of specifying the basis, applying the relevant and requisite socio-economic criteria to exclude socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

In its report submitted on 16.5.1995, the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission had recommended the criteria for excluding socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes. After considering these recommendations, the Government has decided that the benefit of reservation shall not apply to persons/sections mentioned in **Annexure 'A'**, which is enclosed.

All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Heads of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance

- d) parents, either of whom is a Class-I Officer and such parent dies or suffers permanent incapacitation and before such death or such incapacitation has had the benefit of employment in any Inter-national Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years.
- e) parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers die or suffer

permanent incapacitation and before such death or such incapacitation of the both, either of them has had the benefit of employment in any Inter-national Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years.

- A. Provided that the rule of exclusion shall not apply in the following cases:
- a) Sons and daughters of parents either of whom or both of whom are Class-I Officers and such parent(s) dies/die or suffer permanent incapacitation.
 - b) A lady belonging to OBC category has got married to a Class-I Officer and may herself like to apply for a job.

- B. Son(s) and daughter(s) of
- a) parents both of whom are Class-II Officers.
 - b) parents of whom only the husband is a Class-I Officer and he gets into Class- 1at the age of 40 or earlier.
 - c) parents, both of whom are Class- II officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation and either one of them has had the benefit of employment in any Inter-national Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before such death or permanent incapacitation:
 - d) parents of whom the husband is a Class- I Officer (direct recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the wife is a Class-II officer and the wife dies or suffers permanent incapacitation; and
 - e) parents, of whom the wife is a Class- I Officer (Direct Recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the husband is a Class-II officer and the husband dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.

Provided that the rule of exclusion shall not apply in the following cases:

Sons and daughters of

- a) parents, both of whom are Class II officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.
- b) parents, both of whom are Class-II officers and both of them die or suffer permanent incapacitation, even though either of them has had the benefit of employment in any Inter-national Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before their death or permanent incapacitation.

- C. The criteria enumerated in A and B above in this Category will apply mutatis mutatis to officers holding equivalent or comparable posts in PSUs, Banks, Insurance Organizations, Universities, etc. pending the evaluation of the posts on equivalent or comparable basis in these institutions, the criteria specified in Category V below will apply to the officers in these Institutions.
- III Sons(s) and daughter(s) of parents either or both of whom is or are in the rank of Colonel and above in the army and to equivalent posts in the Navy and the Air Force and the Para Military Forces:
Provided that
- If the wife of an Armed Forces Officer is herself in the Armed Forces (i.e. the category under consideration), the rule of exclusion will apply only when she herself has reached the rank of Colonel;
 - the service ranks below Colonel of husband and wife shall not be clubbed together;
 - If the wife of an officer in the Armed Forces is in Civil employment, this will not be taken into account for applying the rule of exclusion unless she falls in the service category under item No. II in which case the criteria and conditions enumerated therein will apply to her independently.

 - Persons in Categories I, II, III and IV who are not disentitled to the benefit of reservation but have income from other sources of wealth which will bring them within the income/wealth criteria mentioned in (a) above.

Explanation:

- Income from salaries or agricultural land shall not be clubbed;
- The income criteria in terms of rupee will be modified taking into account the change in its value every three years. If the situation, however, so demands, the interregnum may be less.
- Where the husband is in some profession and the wife is in a Class II or lower grade employment, the income/wealth test will apply only on the basis of the husband's income.
- If the wife is in any profession and the husband is in employment in a Class II or

lower rank post, then the income/wealth criterion will apply only on the basis of the wife's income and the husband's income will not be clubbed with it.

Explanation: Wherever the expression, ' permanent incapacitation' occurs in this schedule it shall mean incapacitation which results in putting an Officer out of service

I am directed to invite your attention to the Govt. of Haryana, Social Welfare Department Letter No. 1170-SW (1) 95, dated 07.06.1995 on the subject noted above, therein criteria was laid down to assess the creamy layer persons of Haryana Backward Classed in Haryana State. The Backward Classes of Haryana are facing difficulty in obtaining the Backward Classes certificate from the certificate issuing authority due to some understanding in the instruction dated 07.06.1995. After careful consideration the Govt. of Haryana has decided to issue clear cut direction to all the Heads of Department and Deputy Commissioners in the state for issuing Backward Classes Certificate without any further delay.

It is **clarified** that the income from salary will not be taken into account for the purpose of income /wealth tax in who is not covered and while calculating income or wealth **tax** of the Government employee of Backward Classed who is not covered under Annexure-A, description of categories No. I, II (a, b, c, d) and III and IV, hence becoming entitled for the benefit of reservation under Backward Classes category, his salary should not be including but his other sources of income/wealth be including for income/wealth tax.

All the departments are requesting to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Head of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

Subject: Reservation for Economically weaker sections in Direct recruitment in civil posts and services as well as in admissions in Government/Government Aided Educational institutions in the State of Haryana.

I am directed to inform that Government of India has notified The Constitution (One Hundred And Third Amendment) Act. 2019" on 12 January 2019 amending Article 15 and 16 which now read as under.

Amendment of article 15

In Article 15 of the Constitution after clause (5) the following clause shall be inserted namely--

"(6) Nothing in this article or sub-clause (g) of clause (1) of article 19 or clause (2) of article 29 shall prevent the State from making-

- (a) any special provision for the advancement of any economically weaker sections of citizens other than the classes mentioned in clauses (4) and (5); and
- (b) any special provision for the advancement of any economically weaker sections of citizens other than the classes mentioned in clauses (4) and (5) in so far as such special provisions relate to their admission to educational institutions including private educational institutions, whether aided or unaided by the State, other than the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30, which in the case of reservation would be in addition to the existing reservations and subject to a maximum of ten per cent of the total seats in each category. Explanation- For the purposes of this article and article 16, "economically weaker sections" shall be such as may be notified by the state from time to time on the basis of family income and other indicators of economic disadvantage.'

Amendment of article 16

In Article 16 of the Constitution after clause (5) the following clause shall be inserted namely-

"(6) Nothing in this article shall prevent the State from making any provision for the reservation of appointments or posts in favour of any economically weaker sections of citizens other than the classes mentioned in clause (4) in addition to the existing

reservation and subject to a maximum often per cent of the posts in each category".

In the wake of above enabling provisions State Government has considered the matter and decided to provide benefits of reservation on a preferential basis in Civil Posts in all its Departments/ Boards/ corporations/Local Bodies and in Admissions to Government/Government Aided Educational institutions to those Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) who are not converted under the existing scheme of reservation for the scheduled Castes, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B)

2. Quantum Of Reservation

The persons belonging to EWSs who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for scheduled castes Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) Shall get 10% reservation in direct recruitment to group A, B, C and D posts in the department/Board/Corporations/ Local Bodies of government of Haryana and also in admission to government/government aided educational institutions in the state of Haryana.

3. EFFECTING RESRVATION -ROSTER POINT:

- 3.1 Direct recruitment in case of Group-A and B
Roster point No 11-20-30-40-51-60-70-80-90 and 99
- 3.2 Direct recruitment in case of Group- C and D
RosterpointNo.4-14-24-34-43-53-66-76-83 and 94
- 3.3 Where in any recruitment year any vacancy earmarked for EWS cannot be filled up due to non-availability of a suitable candidate belonging to EWS such vacancies for that particular recruitment year shall not be carried forward to the next recruitment year as backlog and will be filled from unreserved category.
- 3.4 Persons belonging to EWS selected against the quota for persons with benchmark disabilities/ex-servicemen shall be placed against the roster points earmarked for EWS.

4. CRITERIA OF INCOME and ASSETS:

- 4.1 Persons who are not covered under the exiting scheme of reservation for Scheduled Caste, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) and whose family has gross annual income below Rs 6.00 Lakh (Rupees six lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e., salary agriculture business profession etc. For the financial year prior to the year of application.
- 4.2 Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS irrespective of the family income.
 - i. Acres of agricultural land and above.
 - ii. Residential fiat of 1000sqft and above.
 - iii. Residential plot of 100sqyards and above in notified municipalities.
 - iv. Residential plot 200 sq. Yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
 - v. Total immovable assets owned are valued at Rs. One Crore or more.
- 4.3 The Property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
- 4.4 The term "Family" for the purpose will Include the person who applies for benefit of reservation, his/her parents, spouse as well as children and siblings below the age of 18years.

5. INCOME AND ASSET CERTIFICATE ISSUING AUTHORITY AND VERIFICATION OF CERTIFICATE:

- 5.1 The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed on production of income and Asset Certificate issued by the competent Authority of the area where the applicant

normally resides.

5.2 The prescribed format for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be as provided at Annexure-I

5.3 The officer who issues the certificate would do the same after carefully verifying all relevant documents following due process as prescribed by the State.

5 ADJUSTMENT AGAINST UNRESERVED VACANCIES:

A person belonging to EWS cannot be denied the right to compete for appointment against an unreserved vacancy. Persons belonging to EWS who are selected on the basis of merit and not on account of reservation are not to be counted towards the quota meant for reservation.

7 The above scheme of reservation will be effective in respect of all direct recruitment vacancies to be notified on or after 01.02.2019.
